1.	You have the right to rer	main silent.	
2.	An attorney will be appointed to represent you at all stages of your case unless you give up this right in writing. The attorney will advise you of how the facts and the law apply to your case and will make legal arguments to the Court. You, your parent(s) or guardian(s) may be required to repay the county for the attorney.		
3.	ve a trial before a judge. If you have a trial, the		
	Prosecutor has to prove to the Court that you are guilty beyond a reasonable		
	doubt. If you are accused of a probation violation, the Prosecutor must prove that		
	it is more likely true than	not that you violated probation.	
4.	You can question any w	itness who is going to testify against you, and you can	
	call your own witnesses	to testify for you.	
5.	If you admit to having vi	olating the law or are found to have violated the law after	
	a trial, you can be placed in detention for up to 90 days for a misdemeanor		
	offense, 180 days for a felony offense, or up to 30 days for a status offense. The		
	Court can place you on	probation for up to three (3) years. Probation conditions	
	will be imposed to hold y	you accountable for your acts, protect the community,	
	and insure an understar	nding and willingness on your part to behave correctly.	
	The Court can also com	mit you to the custody of the Department of Juvenile	
	Corrections until age 21		

6.	If you admit to a charge or are found to have committed an offense, you will be	
	required to pay a \$20.00 fee for each petition, \$.60 per hour for any community service that is required by the Court, and you must pay for your cost of supervision.	
7.	You and/or your parents may be required to reimburse (pay back) any money spent by the state/county for the cost of your care, treatment, probation fees, detention costs, or fees for any placement outside of the home.	
8.	You and/or your parents may be required to reimburse any victim for a loss that was sustained by your actions through payment of restitution.	
9.	If you admit to a charge or are found to have committed an offense in this county and you live in another county, the case may be transferred to the county in which you live.	
10.	If you are not satisfied with the decision of the Court, you may appeal to the next higher court, so long as your Notice of Appeal is filed within 42 days of the entry of the decision.	
11.	Your exercise of any of these rights shall not be held against you.	
12.	If you have any question about these rights, ask the judge at your hearing.	
13.	If you are not a citizen of the United States, and if you admit to or are found to have committed an offense, you could be removed from the country, excluded from entering this country, and/or denied the opportunity to obtain legal status or become a naturalized citizen.
