How do I get rid of the Weeds?

Mechanical, Herbicide and Biological are most common.

We have backpacks for a \$5.00 Service Fee, for maintenance and herbicide. You tell us what weeds you have and where they are; and we can recommend the herbicide required for your needs.

Have a large amount of property and a 4-wheeler. We can provide you with an ATV tank for a \$15.00 Service and maintenance fee. We do not provide the herbicides, but you tell us what weeds you have and where they are. We will determine what herbicide is best and you can purchase the herbicides from a local dealer; if the recommended herbicides are not available contact us to explore other options.

Have your own equipment? We can help you determine the herbicides to use and you can purchase them from your local dealer; if the recommended herbicides are not available contact us to explore other options.

We can also come to your property and spray for you. This is generally done only when you are unable to find a local contractor willing to spray for you. This generally happens when a property is too small for a contractor to agree to provide the service. We want you to be a conscientious Landowner so we will attempt to provide the service for you at our usual costs. We can provide a quote for the approximate cost of the service.

How do I prevent the spread of Invasive's?

Clean Drain and Dry your watercraft and your equipment such as your bait box and your waders, even the paws of your dogs. Remove all plant particles and seeds from your boat, trailer, ATV's, motorcycles, clothing and animals, before you leave the site. If you find them later be sure to put them in a plastic bag in the trash. If you have a boat that has been in water outside of Idaho, remove all water and let it dry for 30 days or have it inspected for mussels prior to entering another water body. If you have been inside of the state, ensure all plant material has been removed. It only takes a small fragment to cause a new reservoir to become infested. If you see something you do not recognize, alert our office. If we cannot identify it, we can send it off to have it identified.
